

SEC. 18 FFA - AGRICULTURE EDUCATION FAIR

GENERAL RULES

1. The judge's decision shall be final
 2. The Georgetown Fair shall take due care to protect exhibits, but will not be held responsible in case of theft, accident or damage to the exhibit.
 3. Each exhibitor must furnish his own feed and bedding.
 4. A committee of three agriculture education instructors appointed by the sectional chairman will rule in the event of conflicts. Any exhibitor lodging a protest will deposit \$50 with the IAVAT Chairman. This sum is forfeited to Section 18 IAVAT if the protest is disallowed. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester, and presented within 24 hours after award is made.
 5. Agriculture education students showing only in the agricultural education fair will have their livestock stalled in a **special area by the fair manager only**. This stalling will be in cooperation with the Georgetown Fair Livestock Superintendent.
 6. Making entries in the Section 18 vocational livestock fair **does not** enter an exhibitor **in the Georgetown Fair Junior and Open Livestock Shows**.
- . Each Section 18 Ag Education Department is expected to have a minimum of two students and the agriculture occupations instructor present on "Pen Day", as announced by the fair manager, in conjunction with the Georgetown Fair Livestock Superintendent.

SPECIAL RULES

1. ALL ENTRIES IN THE AGRICULTURE EDUCATION FAIR MUST BE MADE THROUGH THE LOCAL AG EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR ON THE OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM.
2. All entries must be a part of the student's agricultural experience production program in agriculture education. Ownership must be the students. The enterprise must be in place by June 1, 2008. **Current record books must be presented for each entry at the time entry is made for the 2008 show.** Record books need to meet these requirements:
 - ! Beginning Inventory and/or Purchases
 - ! Labor Records
 - ! Feed Records
 - ! Expenses
 - ! Planting Dates on garden and flower programs
3. A. Only students enrolled in the immediately previous school semester in agriculture occupations classes, or
 - B. Students which have completed a complete school year of agriculture education class or have not been enrolled in an agriculture education class for a period of not over one school year, and are still enrolled in their respective high school, or
 - C. Students which have completed all agriculture education classes offered by the school are eligible to show.
4. An entrant may show no more than two breeds of breeding animals in any division. Poultry will be shown by species.
5. An exhibitor may only have two entries in each class with the exception for market hogs and garden produce.
6. Only a member of a high school agriculture education department can prepare and show animals with the exception of those who have made prior arrangements with the show superintendent.
7. All animals shown must be accompanied by regulation health papers applicable to the specific entry.
8. All animals must be in place by a minimum of 30 minutes before show time, with the exception of those animals which must be weighed.
9. Entry fees must accompany entries.
10. All breeding animals, except the commercial animal breeding classes, must be eligible to register.
11. An animal **may not be shown** in both BREEDING and MARKET classes.
12. Market hogs may be barrows or gilts.
13. Market lambs may be ewes, wethers, or rams. All market lambs must be shorn.
14. Market lambs will be weighed prior to show, time to be announced, and broken into two weight classes with no distinction made to breed.
15. Steers will be weighed prior to show and broken into 4 weight classes with no distinction made as to breed. All FFA steers will be weighed at 7:00 pm on Sunday, August 3, 2008.
16. In order to exemplify the high standards of the FFA, all exhibitors will dress appropriately for exhibition. This will include, but is not limited to: clean clothes, clean shoes, good grooming. Superintendents will have the right to refuse exhibition for failure to comply.
17. An entry fee must be paid for each class shown - a double entry in a class denotes a double entry fee -a group show entry denotes a single entry fee. Entry fees are listed under each livestock division.
18. The Section 18 FFA Beef Show will start following the conclusion of the FFA Dairy Show.

- 19 Only 4 market hogs, 4 wethers, 2 steers, or 4 commercial gilts may be shown by exhibitors.
 20 No market hogs weighing less than 190# can be shown.
 21 It is the responsibility of the **FFA exhibitor and his advisor** to enter FFA animals not entered in the Georgetown Fair open and junior shows in the Jr. Livestock Auction. These animals are to be entered in the sale on Monday, August 4, 2008. They will not be added to the sale list on sale day if not previously entered on FFA Show Day.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The exhibitor of any exhibit judged "Grand Champion" in its division will receive a trophy. The donors of these trophies are listed in the book. A sincere thank you to each trophy donor.
